



Women in Transportation Roundtable Engaging women in leadership roles

The Asia Pacific Gateway Skills Table (Skills Table) and the Western Transportation Advisory Council (WESTAC) are bringing together stakeholders for a conversation on engaging women in leadership roles within the transportation industry.

Women are underrepresented in transportation-related industries and occupations across Canada. The Asia Pacific Gateway Skills Table's (Skills Table) recent research determined that female participation in the transport sector is only 25%, compared to nearly 50% for all other industries.

The Government of Canada is prioritizing increased opportunities for women. The government demonstrated this through appointing a gender balanced Cabinet and by introducing Bill C-25 which will require publicly traded corporations to report on the diversity of its Board of Directors and senior management.

In late 2016, WESTAC conducted interviews with over 30 women and men in the transportation sector. The goal was to understand the career paths of successful women and to identify barriers faced. A review of the conversations found common themes and concerns. The report has been distributed to roundtable participants and will be publicly available shortly.

This half-day roundtable will validate findings from research conducted and will attempt to identify strategies and initiatives to increase women's participation in the transportation sector and its principal occupations.
